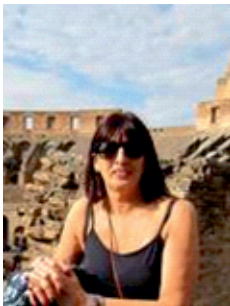

We have two caravans one of which is located at Crowhurst Park near Battle and the other at Combe Haven in St. Leonards. The caravans are fully equipped with everything that one needs from cooker, fridge, central heating, fans, bed linen to toys. Both parks have on site swimming pools and gyms, entertainment and restaurants. Both sites are within easy reach of the Conquest Hospital should medical help be needed.

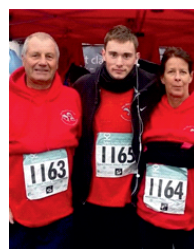
Westfield Fete
